"How far shall defense threats and needs impact the EU Space program?"

Until now, the EU Space Program has mainly developed systems and applications for civil purposes, although it is broadly recognized as a strategic domain having dual-use capacities and where autonomy makes sense. Things are moving with emerging threats on existing in-orbit assets and recognition that maintaining a wall between civil and governmental uses of space capacities would be inefficient and costly. This trend is already explicite in the recently adopted EU constellation program for secured space communications (IRIS²) and is the baseline of the proposed EU Space Strategy for Security and Defense. Linked to geopolitical and technological considerations, this evolution might become a keyingredient of the next EU space program. This is a matter on which we definitely need to reflect upstream, as proposed at this Kangaroo Group Lunch debate.
